Over crowding	Over-parking and site congestion resulting in dangerous manoeuvres, blocking of pedestrian routes	Public and users of Car Park	M	Clear unobstructed visibility for both drivers and pedestrians. Lighting provided in the main car park to help ensure visibility.
Parking	Carelessly parked cars that obstruct pedestrian routes and reduce the visibility of other drivers and pedestrians	Public and users of Car Park	M	Clear unobstructed visibility for both drivers and pedestrians. Lighting provided in the main car park to help ensure visibility.

Deliveries to Businesses	Large vehicles delivering to the shop and take away obstructing pedestrian routes and reducing visibility of drivers and pedestrians, large vehicles manoeuvring in confined space.	Public and users of Car Park	M	Business owners provide a risk assessment and method statement to the Parish Council.
Recycling Centre	Pedestrians loading items into the bins. Excess material overflowing the bins being left on the ground creating an obstruction to vehicles. Broken Glass Lorries emptying the bins obstructing pedestrian routes and reducing visibility of drivers and pedestrians, large vehicles manoeuvring in a confined space.	Public and users of Car Park	M	Clear unobstructed visibility for both drivers and pedestrians. Lighting provided to help ensure visibility. Signage asking excess material to be taken home and for full bins to be notified to the Clerk and Bin Provider. Broken Glass cleared up by Street Cleaner. Bin Providers provide a risk assessment and method statement to the Parish Council.
