	b) Pavement Opposite Drs The works have been designed and costed. Total cost £5,964.69. There is £3,000 S106 Highways money going towards the cost. Cllr Soons is paying for the rest from her Highways budget. Clerk to confirm with Cllr Soons the work has been ordered.	Clerk
	c) VAS 40MPH Colethorpe lane Barrow The VAS in the 40mph does not record speed data. Barrow last had it in March. Currently waiting for the new schedule.	
	<ul> <li>d) Brittons Road Pond</li> <li>The outfall pipes are not silted up as previously thought. Meeting with</li> <li>Highways was promising. Given the difficulty finding a contractor to do the</li> <li>works, Cllr Pearson suggested reengineering the outfall pipes so the enter</li> </ul>	

	<ul> <li>the pond at a higher level. An email was received prior to the meeting stating the reengineering of the pipes was not possible due the amount of work involved and the cost, between £35-40k, with traffic management alone costing £10k.</li> <li>The gas main works on the road between Barrow and Bury St Edmunds has fallen behind schedule. An additional dig team is being bought in. and two way traffic lights will be used at weekends. The end of the closure is estimated to be 8<sup>th</sup> July.</li> </ul>	
6110	DISTRICT COUNCIL REPORT Cllr Houlder was not present.	
6111	<ul> <li>NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN The meeting with West Suffolk Council was full of contradictions. The Parish Council have an issue with how the 78 houses (Woodland Rise) are treated, they are not part of the 2031 plan, initially it was agreed these would come off the total for the 2041 plan however this is now not the case. WSC confirmed that there would be no scaling and there would be no control over how quickly the houses would be built. WSC were challenged over how the 78 houses have been lost. The current position is 170 new homes for Barrow. Barrow has received significantly more development than other key service centres of a similar size.</li> <li>WSC are holding an exhibition in the village hall. All Councillors were encouraged to attended. The planners presenting should accept questions.</li> <li>The Parish Council have always been told that coalescence would not be considered however the two proposed locations for new development contradict this. The proposed sites are Denham Lane (20 homes) and Bury Road (150 homes). WSC warned if the Parish Council persist with their own housing needs figure, Barrow could end up with both the 77 and the 170.</li> <li>Concerns were raised over the fact the protest group only achieved stopping any community benefit from new development and not the development itself.</li> <li>There is a real possibility that Barrow will received a further 170 houses. The NHP could put forward a case for where those houses should go. The Parish Council need to move quickly as WSC are hoping to adopt their new plan in December 2023. The Parish Council want the community to see a benefit from the new housing.</li> <li>Clir Pearson pointed out that a NHP was originally designed for communities wanting more development, not to prevent further development.</li> </ul>	
6112	West Suffolk Local Plan WSC are currently consulting on the local plan due to be adopted in December 2023. The local plan has a 5-year review process but numbers are looked at every year in April. The consultation in Barrow is 8 <sup>th</sup> June.	Clerk
