

### **Parish Council News**

Welcome to the summer edition of Newslink.

Since the Covid-19 lockdown meant that we were unable to hold our annual Parish meeting, I would like to take the opportunity to give my report here.

We started the year with new housing plans centre of most of our meetings and discussions. Following an organised campaign of protest and objection, the Parish Council had no choice but to withdraw from a proposal to bring forward a community project to provide new leisure and community facilities alongside additional new housing. This action only means that the community and leisure facilities will not be built it does not influence the building of more new houses subject to planning permission being granted. This decision to withdraw was followed quickly with a subsequent resolution to bring forward a Neighbourhood Plan that will help to influence future development in and around our village. This process is long and complicated and continues to this day. A report on its progress can be found in this copy of Newslink.

Poor drainage especially along the main street through the village continues to be a problem during periods of heavy rain, and although we believe we have identified what needs to be done, there is a constant struggle to get the work actioned when the District and County Councils budgets are very tight. You can be assured that the Parish Council continues to lobby the relevant departments for the works to be scheduled.

The issue of speeding in the village continues to challenge us. We have now acquired a new Vehicle Activated Sign (VAS) for the exclusive use of our village. This new sign will provide us with data about speeds that it has recorded at locations in the 30 MPH zone. We can use this information to lobby the Police to respond to hotspots identified. The sign cost more than two and a half thousand pounds and we were fortunate to secure significant support from district councillor lan Houlder.

Our village school has decided to join the two-tier system going forward, a consequence of this is of course the fact that the school will have extra year groups to accommodate. You will probably have noticed some construction work going on in the school grounds to provide extra space. We wish them well in the future.

The most dominating feature of course is the arrival of the Covid-19 Virus and its affects on our village life. The Parish Council has partnered up with Barrow Good Neighbours to provide its response to the pandemic. We put out an appeal at the start of lockdown to help us identify vulnerable residents and call for volunteers to come forward who would be willing to help. It is a tribute to our village spirit that we were lucky enough to have a ratio of almost 3 times as many volunteers as there were residents needing help. This generous help has continued for many weeks and is still ongoing today. I personally have been humbled by the level of help people have given freely to others in our village and it confirms my faith in the strength of our community here in Barrow and Denham.

# **Barrow Book Exchange**

During the period of lockdown the BBE has stayed open for business whilst bookshops and libraries have remained closed. There appears to have been no slowing down of the stream of donated books, despite signs reminding people ONLY to take them away, not to leave them.

Several people have used the BBE as a source of books to give away to readers who may be self-isolating, but want to boost their reading. So long as gloves are worn when selecting books in the kiosk, then sanitised and held for about 48 hours before being passed on, they should be safe to use.

Children's books have poured in, most of them in good condition.

We would strongly recommend that anyone with young school age children should come along and select books from this stock. We would also like to persuade people NOT to leave large quantities of books (ie. In boxes or bags) as these block the floor and we simply don't have the facilities to store spill-over stock.

Had the year run to plan I would have been mostly working away from Denham but here I am and the garden is more productive than it has been in years. Apart from self-setting Swiss chard and thuggish Jerusalem artichokes, normally I grow no more than herbs, salad veg and potatoes, this year old and new seeds have been sown. Germinating nearly 100 tomato seeds is one unexpected outcome, I think my compost heap was not hot enough so far from breaking down, these terrorist tomatoes have invaded every growing space. I have wonderful seeds such as Black Coco, Fowler and Emperor of Russia beans, Lettuce Bronze Arrow has found its mark but we have been faced with cold nights and now hot dry days. # **Neighbourhood Plan**

In the spirit of keeping calm and carrying on during these difficult times, we've been doing our best to progress Barrow-cum-Denham's Neighbourhood Plan.

You might recall from my previous Newslink report, that the process of developing a Neighbourhood Plan can be thought of in three phases: collecting data, analysing the data and reporting. We are in the first phase. Some activities - such as assessing the parish's future housing need and listing all the heritage assets such as ancient monuments and important buildings - have been completed and others are underway.

The natural environment and wildlife habitats in and around Barrow and Denham are one of the things that make this such a great place to live. They may well influence some of the policies in the eventual Plan. Understandably, it's a complicated subject that requires rigorous investigation by specialists. Recently, we applied for and received a further grant so that this work can be carried out by external consultants, Aecom. Their report is due in the autumn.

We had planned to have our Neighbourhood Plan survey underway by now, but we didn't feel that it was appropriate to launch it during the recent lockdown. We'll be reviewing matters at our next Parish Council meeting and if the decision is to proceed, there will be announcements via the Parish Council web-site, noticeboard and Facebook.

This survey will be your chance to have your say about how the parish develops over the next twenty years. It will be made available on-line and in hard copy and contains about 50 multiple-choice questions where we'll ask you about your opinion. Remember, it's not a quiz – there are no right or wrong answers – we're simply asking what you think on issues such as amenities, the environment, infrastructure and future development. It takes just a few minutes to complete. As well as specific questions there's also space for you to tell us more generally about your views.

# An Oak Tree trying hard by David Holmes

So far we have had a beautiful spring so different from the gales earlier in the year which did so much damage. Gales are nothing new, when we moved into our wreck of a house in 1975 one of the first things needing doing was to renew and replace the pantiles on the roof. Pantiles especially eighteenth century ones take time to bed down, one evening that autumn we were able to stand down the garden and watch a relentless wind peel off rows of pantiles ... and drop them on my car


