

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

At the meeting in February, the Parish Council welcomed a large number of parents who were very concerned about proposed changes to the school transport system. Having assured those present of their support, the council agreed to write to each member of the Suffolk County Council cabinet seeking an assurance that children from Barrow would suffer no discrimination in transport provision because the local primary school is part of the BSE 'All Through Trust'. To date we have not had the courtesy of a reply from any member of the County Council, although they did acknowledge our concerns in an interview with the Bury Free Press.

Parishioners will be aware of the serious problems caused by the A14 over-night closures, and the failure of Highways England to organise and manage an effective diversion route. The Parish Council has met with representatives of Highways England and we are seeking compensation for the damage caused to the grass verges within the village. Highways England maintain that they have no liability if drivers choose to ignore the signed diversion route. Nevertheless, we will continue to press our claim and update you in due course.

Another issue which a huge amount of concern, is the failure of the County Council to adequately repair the huge number of 'potholes' on our roads. The county highways department seem to have adopted a policy of only repairing some holes, whilst leaving adjacent ones unfilled. This seems to be total waste of public money and we have written to the County Councillor with responsibility in this area, Jane Storey, and asked that the policy be reviewed. We have also asked our own County Councillor, Karen Soons to follow this up.

Over the past few years we have had many discussions with the County Council about ways in which we can reduce 'speeding' within the parish. One of the main problem sites is Bury Road, where many individuals simply ignore the 30mph limit. Part of the problem is that the 30mph limit on the approach to the village starts some distance from the first dwellings, and there is a sense that the current signage is somewhat inadequate. Therefore, the Parish Council has agreed to fund some improvements along this stretch of road, and we hope that work will commence in the very near future.

Can you please note that the Annual Parish meeting will take place on **Thursday April 26th at 7.00pm in the Village Ha**ll when the Parish Council will give their annual report. The Parish Council is conscious that attendance at this annual meeting has declined year on year and therefore, we are considering changing the format of the meeting this year to much more of a **question and answer** session. We have invited individuals from the Police and both the Borough and County Councils, so please try and make time in your busy lives to come along, ask questions, and challenge elected representatives about issues that affect you and your family.

Finally, can I remind you that the Parish Council meets on the first Monday of each month (except January and August) at 7.15pm in the Village Hall. We welcome members of the public to our meetings so individuals and groups have an opportunity to raise matters of community interest before we begin the formal business of the meeting. We always have an item '**Public Forum**' on our agenda however if you do wish to raise an issue it is helpful if you can contact the Parish Clerk in advance so we can make sure we allocate appropriate time for discussion.

Barrow Book Exchange

It was in 2011 under the *Adopt-a-Kiosk* scheme that the Parish Council bought the old telephone kiosk for £1 and soon after a team of volunteers gave it a new coat of paint. Now, seven years on, the paintwork needs freshening up and we would like to invite both newcomers and those original volunteers to tackle the job once again in the Spring. Before this work starts, the overhanging tree branches will be cut back by a local tree specialist.

As a book exchange the BBE continues to receive regular book donations from the community and there's a stalwart team of volunteers who help to keep the shelves reasonably tidy. For any book lover there's always some undiscovered gem on the shelves to take home; to spotlight these curiosities and good reads, we're adding a *Book of the Month* review in *The Stile* magazine as from March 2018.

What to do about excess books has become a more pressing matter in recent months. Regularly volunteers fill their car boots with the surplus books, delivering them to charity shops in Bury St Edmunds. Water-damaged copies left on the floor of the kiosk are placed in recycling bins. A suggestion has been made to the Parish Council that a Book Recycling Bank should be positioned near the telephone kiosk as a solution to this problem.

Some Garden Friends—by David Homes

If you would like some free entertainment outside your window, buy yourself a bird feeder. Hang it near enough so that you can see clearly what is going on. The birds will soon find your feeder and start the show. Some of my favourite visitors are long-tailed tits who usually go around in family groups. The record, so far, on my feeder is seven - all feeding at once. Soon they will be building their beautiful domed nest in the hedgerow. The nest is made of lichen and cobwebs, lined with feathers. It is so tight-a-fit that the birds have to fold their long tails over their backs when they go inside.

Sparrows are other visitors around the feeder. Their numbers have been in decline over the years partly due to loss of habitat. House sparrows (the name gives it away) like to nest under roof tiles. Modern buildings now tend to have close fitting roof materials so there is no room for sparrows. Our house roof is very old and the tiles have lots of gaps, so we have two large flocks of sparrows, front and back. On spring mornings the birds can be seen busily carrying beaks full of nesting material into the roof. There must be half the garden up there. ... On the plus side I just think of it as extra insulation.
