

Welcome to the Spring edition of Newslink.

We are now in the Queens Platinum Jubilee year. A remarkable achievement which will not be seen again for generations. The Parish Council along with the Church and residents of our Villages are planning many events to mark this occasion. The PC will also be participating in the "Queens Canopy" by planting new trees around the area. More updates regarding events can be found in Newslink.

The Neighbourhood Plan continues to move forward along with the District Council's development plans. Once the PC have a proposed Neighbourhood Plan it will be put to a referendum of residents in Barrow and Denham. Just a word of caution regarding the outcome of the referendum, should it be rejected we could possibly try to alter it, but this would in the meantime, leave the Villages vulnerable to developers without any input into what happens.

As we enter the season of spring, I am happy to be able to welcome the removal of all Covid restrictions in Law. Of course, this means that we are entering a new period of personal responsibility. There remains a great deal of pressure on our doctor's surgery, and they respectfully ask users to continue with certain restrictions.

I note that for the second time the plans for two new homes in the garden of the Three Horseshoes Public House have been rejected by the District Council. As you will know the PC objected to these plans on several points as did many of the locally affected residents.

With the easing of restrictions, it is good to see how strongly the bookings for the Village Hall have returned. This has allowed the Village Hall management committee to invest some extra money in the venue. Of particular note is a muchimproved outside lighting provision, a ramp at the side Fire Exit and a substantial investment in a brand new kitchen/ bar area in the hall itself.

It was good to see our new Community engagement Police Officer at our February monthly meeting. He was able to update those present with the current situation regarding offending in the area as well as informing us of future plans to increase Police presence in the village. We have hopefully secured his attendance at our annual PC meeting where he will be able to address more of our residents as well as being available to take questions regarding policing in the area.

BARROW CUM DENHAM NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

PROGRESS REPORT

Since I last reported on progress with the Neighbourhood Plan, the main thing to report now is that we have still not had the further meeting with the planners from West Suffolk Council that was originally scheduled for December. They tell us that they will not be ready for this until March at the earliest.

The importance of this meeting is that this is when they will be letting us know their figure for the number of new dwellings Barrow needs to accommodate over the new Local Plan period, which runs to 2040. Until we know that figure, and how (if at all) it differs from our own, we cannot finalise the policies on which our Neighbourhood Plan will be based.

However, all this doesn't mean that work on our plan is at a standstill. We are making progress on completing other components. In particular, we are working with our consultants AECOM on the next stages of an essential component of the Neighbourhood Plan, namely the Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA). AECOM have already begun work on Phase 2 of the SEA, which is the Environmental Report. The Neighbourhood Plan Working Group will be meeting AECOM in the next week to review progress.

It is important to stress that the Neighbourhood Plan could not be prepared to the required depth and detail without the use of consultants and that the cost of engaging them is fully covered by grants, so is at zero net cost to the Parish Council.

We have also met to discuss how best to carry out the next stage of public consultation, which we now expect to take place towards the end of May or early June.

Have your say - new hospital plans

West Suffolk Hospital was named as one of 40 new hospitals to be built by 2030 under the Government's Health Infrastructure Plan. This is the biggest hospital building programme for a generation – a once in a lifetime opportunity to deliver a new health and care facility for the people of west Suffolk.

In December 2020, the West Suffolk NHS Foundation Trust announced Hardwick Manor as the preferred site for the new hospital. The Trust is preparing to submit an outline planning application to build on the site in spring 2022.
