PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

It is with great sadness that I have to report on the death of Stan Bullock, a former Vice Chairman of the Parish Council, and Chairman for many years of the Village Hall Management Committee. Stan was also active in other organisations within the village, such as the Bowls Club, and the Garden Club and willingly gave up many hours of his time in the service of our community. In a world where so many people are happy to sit on the sidelines, by his actions, Stan was an example of what we mean when we talk about community service. Our thoughts and condolences go to his family.

On a happier note, we were delighted to hear that our Parish Clerk, Kat Bowe gave birth to a daughter Georgia, Naomi, on the 14th May. Congratulations to Kat, and husband Matt.

The excessive amount of rain we have endured over recent months has, once again, highlighted the serious problems with drainage that affect certain areas of the village. Council minutes dating back many years demonstrate that this is not a new problem, but it certainly appears to have worsened in the recent past. The Parish Council has been very active in pursuing the County Council to take action on our behalf but, as always it comes down to resources. In an attempt to find some sort of a solution, the Parish Council have indicated that they might be able to allocate some funding from their own reserves if, **and it is a big if**, the County Council are prepared to allocate some of their budget to Barrow. Following a recent meeting with the County we are waiting for a formal response, but even if they do agree to make resources available it is unlikely to be until the financial year 2019/2020.

At the meeting in May, the Parish Council were updated on an increase in police activity in the village, some of it involving anti-social behaviour. There was some disappointment that we no longer have a regular police presence at our monthly meetings, and our representatives will be

raising this at a forthcoming public meeting organised by the Police & Crime Commissioner for Suffolk.

The Parish Council has now received details of the formal planning application for 75 new homes on land East of Barrow Hill. A public consultation meeting was held in the Village Hall on the 31st May, and the comments and objections raised by members of the public will form part of our

formal response to the planning authority. Whilst we cannot guarantee that any of these will be incorporated into the final planning decision we hope that Hopkins Homes, the developers, will take note, and work with those most affected by the development.

Finally, can I remind you that the Parish Council meets on the first Monday of each month (except January and August) at 7.15pm in the Village Hall, and we welcome members of the public to our meetings. So that individuals and groups have an opportunity to raise matters of community interest before we begin the formal business of the meeting, we have an item 'public forum' on our agenda. If you do wish to raise an issue, it is helpful if you can contact the Parish Clerk in advance, so we can make sure we allocate appropriate time for discussion.

Things to watch out for in Barrow and Denham

As I write this towards the end of May, nature has been making up for lost time after the beast from the east. The orchids in Denham are now starting to appear along the road on the left hand side past Keeper's Lodge and before the Denham Estate entrance. Orchids are very fussy and prefer the poorest of soils, perhaps that is the reason they have never colonised the other side of the road. For the past three years there has been a small colony of bee orchids growing on the grass triangle at the corner of Brockley Lane and Barrow Road. They are happily living on a mixture of road dust, sand and chippings, please do not pick them as they have a very complicated lifecycle and will probably not return if picked. I am happy to see that the greenfinches are back in Denham Lane, these birds have been suffering from disease for several years and their numbers dropped considerably. You should spot them in your garden, they are quite a large finch slightly bigger than a sparrow and, of course, their name gives it away - they are olive green. Listen for their cry, it sounds like a creaking door. I am sure you will have seen buzzards circling over Barrow and Denham, but have you seen the red kite? It is longer and slimmer than a buzzard, his wings look a bit like an M and his tail is V shaped which he twists from side to side just like the ribbons on an old-fashioned Mary Poppins let's go fly a kite
