

Summer 2021



.Welcome to the summer edition of Newslink.

As Newslink goes to press we are waiting for the last lifting of Covid restrictions which I fear will be pushed back. We do however now have both our village pubs re-opened and being well supported. The Doctors surgery continues to function with Covid restrictions, and you may have noticed that building work is well under way on the extension to the surgery to help cope with the increasing village population. It should also be noted that the Parish Council is once again able to hold its meetings face to face and both the May and June meetings have taken place in the Village Hall with suitable precautions. We will however need to observe the restricted numbers allowed in the Village Hall until the final lifting of Covid restrictions takes place.

After more than 2 years of lobbying by the Parish Clerk, we finally have the speed warning sign being deployed on Colethorpe Lane in the 40 MPH limit zone. This sign is a shared asset and we have been told that we can expect it to return at regular intervals now we have established the site.

There remains uncertainty about the future of the Town Estate Room in the Village. Whilst the property has no connection to the Parish Council, we have always seen the building as a village asset indeed we donated significant funds to the last extensive renovations. The ultimate decisions are made by the Trustees, and it seems that it is their aim to grant a commercial lease on the property which would alter its definition as village asset. The Parish Council continues to lobby on behalf of residents.

The Neighbourhood Plan has received a set back in April with the resignation of Councillor Howard who was the driving force behind the Plan, and who has committed countless hours of his personal time to bring forward the Plan. The Parish Council is grateful for the extensive work that Councillor Howard has already done, and we are determined to continue working to complete the project.

You may well be aware of a planning application to build 2 houses in the beer garden of the Three Horseshoes public house. The Parish Council was not able to support the application and have lodged their objection to the plans. We now await the planner's decision.

I hope you can all enjoy the current fine summer weather, and that we are soon finally free of restrictions placed upon us.

Barrow cum Denham Good Neighbours Scheme

Our volunteers provide services such as lifts to West Suffolk Hospital, the surgery, the post office, the hairdresser, etc, or carry out minor DIY jobs/repairs, or help to fill in forms. We can also offer some help with learning to use a computer, or tablet/smartphone if desired.

All services are free except when a lift is involved, when we charge 40p per mile (present rate) to cover the driver's costs.

Whilst social distancing is in place, however, these services have been restricted and lifts have only possible where the volunteer driver has a large enough car that you can sit in a rear seat and be over a metre apart, and both your driver and you must wear a face mask. This has limited us to only a few drivers, but we are still able to offer this service. Shopping, collecting prescriptions etc are taking place as always.

We very much hope that government restrictions will be lifted in June, after which we look forward to offering a full service again, and arranging coffee mornings that will be open to all.

Dear Friends,

As I write this, we are just a short way off from what we have all been hoping for - a chance to be free from the Covid restrictions that have been in place for so long. Like a hibernating dormouse, some of us have been gradually resurfacing and getting used to being out and about amongst the community, whilst others, sadly, have not been able to. If you are like me, then you are probably feeling very cautious, and still unsure of what we can or cannot do - and possibly still worried about what the future holds.

Just a couple of days ago, I was hopping up and down in excitement! I witnessed a flock of swifts flying in helter-skelter fashion over the houses in Barrow. Their screams were exhilarating. Ponds by David Holmes

Water is a necessity to life, it was in the past, it is now and it will be in the future. Barrow is built on a hill, there is no river nearby, so ponds were very important. The village is on an area of heavy clay therefore lining the pond with puddled clay was a useful way of stopping leakage. Apparently at one time the village had at least 58 ponds. Many of the ditches (now piped) flow into the main ones so they were like giant storage tanks. I have it on good authority that Brittons Pond (the main one on The Street) was named after a working horse called Britton who used to drink there.

The two ponds on The Street would have had a gentle slope at one end to help water the livestock and to wash down the wagons. The overflow ditches for the ponds (now under houses) would probably have flowed down the valley to Brockley Lane, but we cannot be sure about this.

Healthy ponds are a wonderful source of wildlife, we all know about the ducks but there are a myriad other plants and species that rely on them. At this time of year one of my pleasures is to stand by the pond down Brockley Lane and watch the ducks and moorhens with their young. Mother ducks tend to chase moorhens because they are known to drown ducklings. This year a mother duck built her nest against our house wall beside the kitchen hot water outlet pipe - so she had free central heating, whether the warmth helped her we don't know but she produced 10 healthy ducklings. As I write this early in the morning a large fox has just loped up the drive and disappeared into the orchard - watch out ducks!

POLICE COMMUNITY REPORT

I am pleased to advise that Suffolk Constabulary have appointed PC Lee Andrews-Pearce as our Community Engagement Officer who took up his position at the end April. He is keen to engage with the community and would welcome the opportunity to attend functions such as Parish Council meetings, fetes etc. In addition, it is likely we will see a greater police presence in the village in the form of foot and car patrols.

With regard to reported crime for the period February – April 2021 inclusive, there was a total number of 15, of which 12 for violence and sexual offences (this includes many categories including historic, harassment, indecent assault, domestic violence as well as murder, rape etc; 2 public order offences and 1 criminal damage/arson.
