Parish Council News

We have had a relatively quite period as a Parish Council and have been able to deal with some of the more routine issues affecting our Parish. We have seen the installation of the new larger combined waste bin at the bus stop near the recycling area. The new play equipment has been installed at the playing field. Once again, a big thank you to all who donated following the fire damage, which enabled this extra equipment to be purchased.

As you may be aware, we are trying to deploy the VAS (vehicle activated speed sign) to different locations around the village. One of the problems we face is that we only have access to the sign for one month in every three, as it is shared with two other villages. As a Parish Council we are conscious of the problem of speeding in our village and therefore give this matter a high priority. Consequently, we have resolved to purchase a VAS sign for the exclusive use of Barrow.

An issue has come to the attention of the Parish Council via the Village Hall Management Committee, is the problems caused by instances of inconsiderate parking blocking the pavement as it passes across the front of the Village Hall. I would personally ask anyone using the Village Hall carpark to avoid parking on this area of the pavement which is causing problems for pedestrians. In the meantime, we are costing some 'No Parking' lines to be applied in the problem area.

Whilst some improvements have been made, we continue to suffer as a village from poor drainage in certain areas. I can assure you that we keep chasing both Highways and the County Council to secure funding that will allow these issues to be rectified. Of note at the moment, is the roadway opposite the Brittons Road Pond, and the pavement and roadway from Johnson Road towards the village centre.

The Barrow Village firework display took place again this year, sadly the weather was not kind to us, and attendance was down on previous years. The display itself was as usual of a fantastic standard and Barrow has really grown a very good reputation in the area for putting on a terrific event. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Christopher James and Tom Wesley, who are stepping down from organising the display, for many years of their selfless work on this project. If anyone feels they might be interested in volunteering to help with the event in the future please get in touch, we would be happy to meet with you.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be in the Committee Room of the Village Hall on Monday 3rd February 2020 at 7:15pm.

Neighbourhood Plan

Barrow-cum-Denham's Neighbourhood Plan is underway and this short note aims to provide you with a progress update.

The process of developing a Neighbourhood Plan can be thought of three phases: collecting data, analysing the data and reporting. We are in the first phase and this includes a number of activities including a heritage assessment; a housing needs assessment; a call for sites and a community consultation.

The heritage assessment is being carried out by external, independent consultants and they are considering the parish's (surprisingly large number of) listed buildings and scheduled ancient monuments which might impact planning matters. The housing needs assessment is also being carried out by external consultants and, working in conjunction with West Suffolk Council, this work aims to define the number and type of houses that are required to be built in the parish from 2019 to 2041. It's important to note here that the drive for more houses is not set by the Parish Council but rather by UK central government and specifically their national house-building targets. Our task is to determine Barrow-cum-Denham's fair share of the national targets. The call for sites is self-explanatory – it's a call to landowners within the parish to nominate sites that are available for development. The community consultation will be your chance to have your say about how the parish develops over the next twenty years. We are drafting a consultation questionnaire which will be made available on-line and in hard copy for those who prefer good old pen and paper. It will be open to all parishioners - not just adults and the questionnaire contains around 50 multiple-choice questions about amenities, the environment, infrastructure and future development. It should only take a few minutes to complete. As well as specific questions there's also space for you to tell us more generally about what you think. There will be further information about how you can have your say once the questionnaire is finalised.






