PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Welcome to the Summer edition of Newslink.

Since the last edition we have had an eventful few months. At the recent Parish Council election, Chairman Graham Judge decided not to stand for re-election. I would like on behalf of the Parish Council and residents of Barrow, to thank Graham for some 15 years of service to our community. Also Martin Sanders decided not to stand and I thank him for his past efforts. This means that we welcome two new Councillors onto our Parish Council, namely Mark Howard and Mick Burton, good luck gentlemen.

Following Graham's decision not to stand this meant that a new Chairman needed to be elected at our first meeting. I was the councillor who was elected at that meeting. I have been vice chairman for several years and have been a councillor for about 10 years. I have lived in Barrow for almost 30 years with my wife Tina Pearson who currently also looks after the village hall bookings. Our three boys have all been born in Barrow.

The new council held its annual meeting in May. This was an extremely well attended meeting with around 125 residents present on the night. Following our annual reports being delivered, the meeting was largely dominated by concerns over future development in the village. Despite the high level of emotion around the subject of development the meeting was mostly constructive and people put forward their concerns respectfully and these have been taken on board by the current Parish Council. I would like to take this opportunity to confirm that the Parish Council remains an independent body which does not align itself with outside organisations, but strives to represent the views of the residents of our village . I would remind you all that residents are welcome at our monthly meetings where there is an opportunity for people to bring their concerns to the attention of the Parish Council.

Finally I would like to say how I believe we are very lucky to live in such a great village, but there are some concerns about recent events. Firstly we have seen a couple of incidents of vandalism in our village including the damage caused to the play equipment and more recently a bench in the cemetery was deliberately damaged. I hope this is not a continuing trend. Also we have seen some anti social use of the recycling area in the Parish Council car park. Can I ask politely please that residents do not dump household waste next to the book exchange , and could we please not leave empty glass bottles beside the bottle banks. There are contact numbers on the various recycling bins please feel free to phone the contractors if you see that they require emptying, or contact the Parish Clerk who will ensure it is done. I am sure that we face some very eventful months ahead, and you can always keep up with village matters via the Parish Council website, village notice boards and of course your regular copies of Newslink.

From time to time, by special arrangement (as, normally, the BBE can only take a maximum of FIVE books at any one time), members of the community kindly donate small collections of books to the BBE. This happened recently when thirty books were donated by the family of the late Scilla Cairns who lived on the Green in Barrow. Those who remember Scilla will know that she loved books, was a member of a local book club and each year her sons gave her the Booker prize short list.

Our Barrow Book Exchange was first set up with a large collection of Scilla's books, and now John and Jenny Cairns have given us a further generous donation of her books. Titles include a blend of biographical non-fiction and literary fiction such as Hilary Clinton's *Living History;* Joan Bakewell's *Centre of the Bed;* Andrew Marr's *My Trade* along with Joanna Trollope's *Marrying the Mistress* and *Friday Nights* and Tracy Chevalier's *The Last Runaway.*

The helping hands which keep the shelves tidy and eject old or unwanted material, continue to make the BBE attractive to all members of the community. Huge thanks.
