Barrow-cum-Denham Neighbourhood Plan – Update for December '22 Issue of Newslink

Following on from the extraordinary meeting held on the 18thOctober 2022, at which a vote took place to select our preferred site, (Barrow Hill was selected), we arranged a meeting with West Suffolk, which took place on the 28thOctober 2022.

This was attended by Cllr's John Pearson, Richard Ford and Ralph Rawlings from Barrow, and Ann-Marie Howell, Marie Smith from Planning of West Suffolk.

We formerly advised West Suffolk of our decision and our opposition to the Bury Road site, stating our reasons why, which includes coalescence with Burthorpe, proximity to historic and listed buildings, benefits to the community, concerns regarding access to Bury Road

With regard to the Denham Lane site, which is for 20 dwellings, this is of particular concern to the Parish Council, and in our view is totally inappropriate for the area. Our objections are similar to those of Bury Road with particular concern relating to access onto the Barrow/Denham Lane which is very narrow and therefore hazardous to pedestrians as well as motorists. West Suffolk claimed that 10% of development has to be on land less than 1 hectare. We pointed out that this can be achieved through infill and that there was already planning permission granted for some 9 dwellings. This was unacceptable to West Suffolk and unlikely to pass Planning Inspectorate requirements. We have since discovered that the 10% can be applied to the whole of West Suffolk and does not necessarily have to be from a specific development such as ours

At this stage West Suffolk are not prepared to budge from their original decision and in our view are not adopting the spirit of the NP process; they should be supporting the local community.

We will continue to challenge their decision and are engaging with Planning Consultants and seeking further advice.

In addition, we have obtained legal advice from solicitors specialising in planning law and who are well versed in the NP process. They believe we have grounds to challenge West Suffolk's decision. Based on this, we have sent a letter to West

If you wish, you can come dressed as an angel, shepherd, king, sheep, star..... and be part of the Christmas story!

Angels aren't just for Christmas, but wherever you see one, do remember that during the season of Advent and Christmas especially, they bring glad tidings of joy. I wish you all a very happy and blessed Christmas
