I am pleased to report some progress.

 Our consultants AECOM are proceeding with their consideration of reasonable alternatives to the potential sites for development through the Strategic Environmental Assessment process. They are examining four options for delivering the 77 new homes the Parish Council still believes will be sufficient to meet Barrow-cum-Denham's quota of new housing for the duration of the emerging Local Plan, which will take us through to 2040.

It is important to emphasise at this stage that no definitive decision has yet been made in relation to the sites that the Neighbourhood Plan will recommend.

2 West Suffolk Council has at last given us dates for a meeting, which will exchange news of progress with our respective Plans and give us an indication of its revised figure of housing requirement for Barrow. That meeting will take place in the week beginning 25 April.

# **COMMUNITY POLICE REPORT – APRIL 22**

### MESSAGES

I cascaded two messages, firstly to inform the public of a theft of oil, value £600, from the Doctors surgery on the weekend of the 12<sup>th</sup>March and secondly to announce that the Police will be at the

village hall on the morning of 9<sup>th</sup> April to meet the public. They have organised posters which I have distributed around the village.

With regard to the vehicle crime, these relate to the incidence in Beale Road, all 7 of them occurring in the same night, the police have confirmed that a suspect is pending prosecution. With regard to the 5 crimes reported on or near Poplar Close, I can confirm that that this involves 3 separate households - none were sexual.

During March a resident reported that a driver, travelling at high speed (not verified) crashed into a deer and left it. At the same time the resident expressed concern at the amount of fast driving occurring in the village. We had previously been promised that the newly formed Kestral team would conduct speed checks, particularly at Barrow Hill, this has not yet happened, evidently this newly formed team have been heavily involved with the drug County Lines. I contacted our Community Police Officer to request if he could conduct a speed check, which he did on the 18<sup>th</sup>March; there were no enforcements which he believes was due to drivers flashing oncoming vehicles to warn them.
